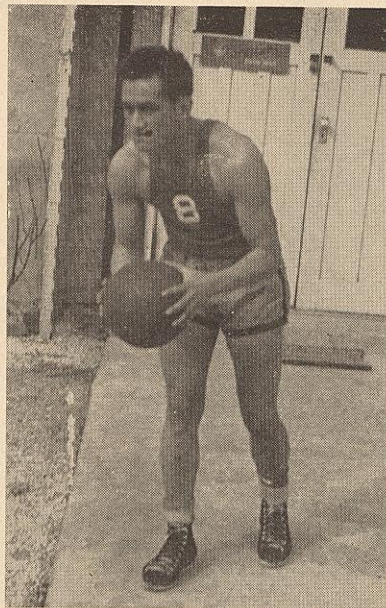


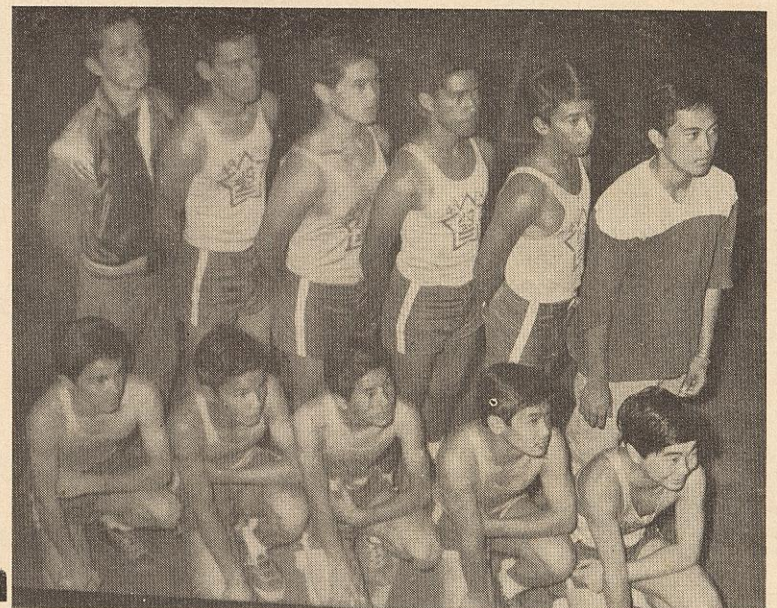
# RECREATION

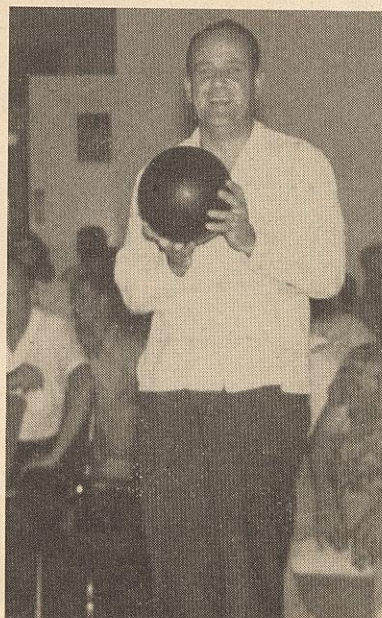

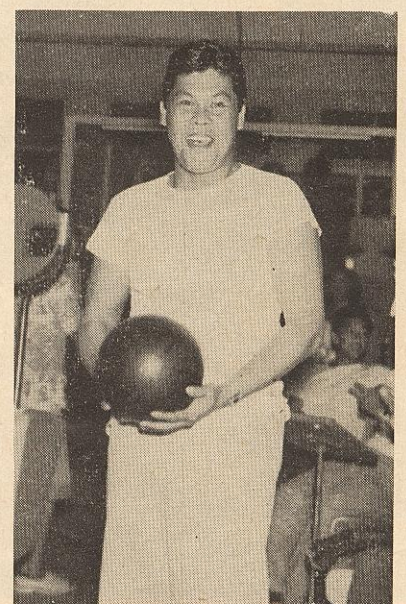

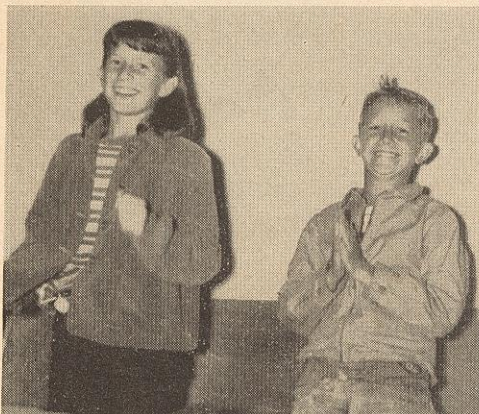
**HERE'S SMILING FRANK FRIS-BEE** of Wahiawa personnel department, lining up the ball for what he hopes is going to be a strike.



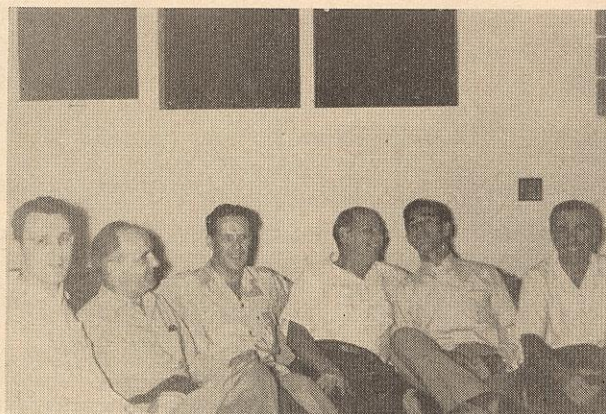
**HIGH MAN** in recent match at Wahiawa was Frank Tyau, with score of 541. His team, the Country Jacks, beat the City Slickers.



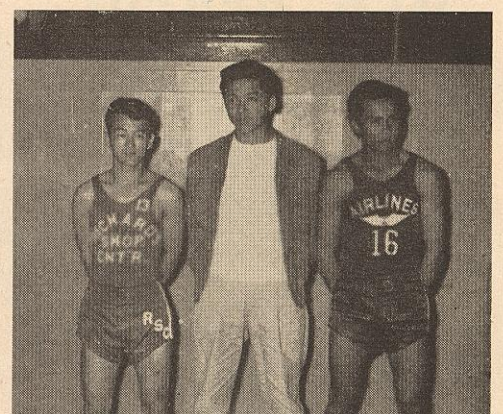
