

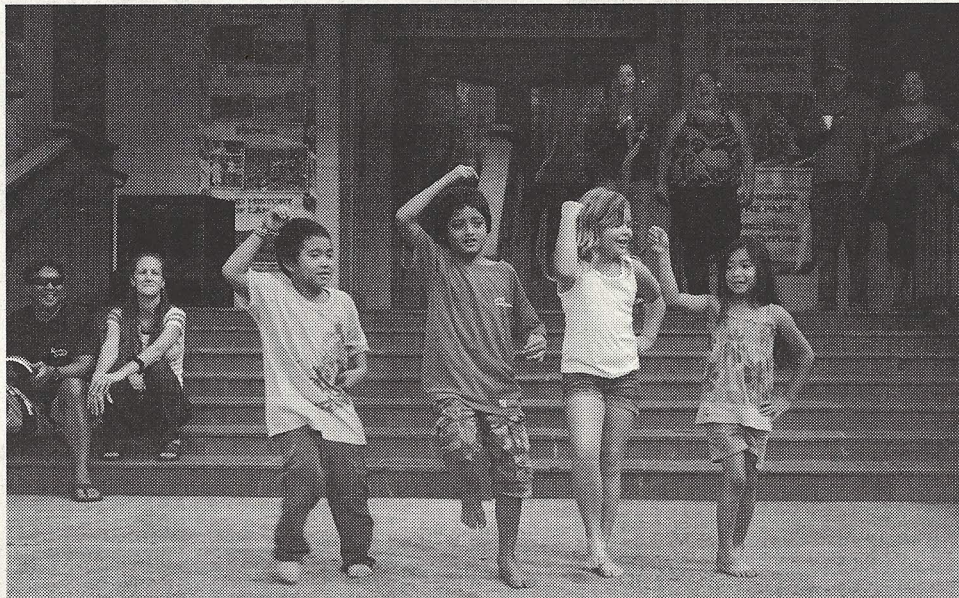
First Anniversary Celebrated
