ROYAL PATENT.

Upon Confirmation by the Land Commission.

WHEREAS, The Board of Commissioners to quiet Land Titles have by their decision awarded unto Fanny Young Award 6579² an estate of **Freehold** less than Allodial, in and to the Land hereafter described, and whereas Emma Hahione by her Attorney in fact, Miss J. Cartwright, having applied to the Minister of the Interior for a Royal Patent for the Mau-puaa of Maunalei, Island of Lanai, under the above Award, and have filed a true copy of the Survey of said Land, **And, Whereas** by a resolution of the Privy Council the commutation on said land was relinquished.

THEREFORE, Holohoukani by the Grace of God, King of the Hawaiian Islands, by this Royal Patent, makes known to all men, that he has, for himself and his successors in office, ~~this day~~ granted and given absolutely, in Fee Simple, unto Fanny Young

all that certain piece of Land ~~situate~~ known as the Mau-puaa of Maunalei, situate in the Island of Lanai and described as follows:

Commencing at a stake on the northeast corner of Land at its junction with Tahulu at high-water mark, one-half chain to eastward of small creek, and running
South 21° 20' West 160 chains to stake on Western shoulder of hill called Nawaku; thence
South 1° East 122 chains across gulch of Hainakapuaa, and following Southern edge of Hainakapuaa to summit of hill called Wahane, thence striking Northern edge of gulch called Papaha-hamao to its junction with Maunalei, which gulch it crosses at right angles, and descending gulch of Papaha-hamao crosses to hill called Papukau; thence
North 65° 30' West 76 chains to stake in bluff of reef south called Nau along Wahane; thence
North 44° East 316.75 chains along ridge of Nau and Leupole to its junction with gulch of Maunalei at the lap of Tahulu; thence following along bottom of gulch to the sea at Ho-lou's Stone, a little below high-water mark to place of commencement and containing an area of 3122.58 acres more or less.

Note - The land also comprises the sea contained between the reef and high-water mark from a line drawn N. 21° 20' East to reef, and a line from Holohoukani's Stone North 44° East to reef.

Containing 321 1/2 .38 Acres,
more or less; excepting and reserving to the Hawaiian Government, all mineral or metallic mines of every
description.

To Have and to Hold the above granted Land in Fee Simple, unto the said Fanny Young
Fanny Young her Heirs and Assigns forever,
subject to the taxes to be from time to time imposed by the Legislative Council, equally upon all Landed
Property held in Fee Simple.

In Witness Whereof, I have herunto set my hand, and caused the Great
Seal of the Hawaiian Islands to be affixed, this twelfth
day of May 1876.
