ROYAL PATENT.

Upon Confirmation by the Land Commission.

WHEREAS, The Board of Commissioners to quiet Land Titles have by their decision awarded unto

Mr. Kekauonohi ————— E. C. Amado, 11216.

an estate of **Freehold** less than Allodial, in and to the Land hereafter described, and whereas *proper* application having been made to the Minister of the Interior by Mr. H. Gibson, the present occupier of the Ahupuaa of Palawai, Islands of Lanai and whereas the commutation on said land was relinquished by order of the Privy Council.

WHEREFORE, ^{kalakaous} ~~by~~ by the Grace of God, King of the Hawaiian Islands, by this Royal Patent, makes known to all men, that he has, for himself and his successors in office, this day granted and given absolutely, in Fee Simple, unto Mr. Kekauonohi.

all that certain piece of Land ~~situate at~~ ^{known as the Ahupuaa of Palawai} in the Island of Lanai, and described as follows:

- Commencing at a concrete post (the same being the point of commencement of Lamas Survey), at the sea shore near the middle of straight Harbor the boundary being
1. N. 67.55. W. true 1940 ft along Lamas to a stake on the W. side of the road marked with a cross
 2. N. 6.30. ————— 850 ————— up road to stone on east side of same
 3. N. 8.17. ————— 744.0 ————— in road marked with a cross
 4. N. 29.55. E. ————— 3750 ————— to a redwood post on edge of Palawai crater and 500 ft west of an old stone stake from
 5. N. 35.3. E. ————— 6575.5 ————— ^{Palawai} across Palawai crater from larger rock marked with a cross at mouth of Palawai gulch
 - Whence along Kaohai up bottom of said gulch, and the West branch of same to a stone marked thus Y, and from said stone up west bank to a rock on edge of gulch marked with a cross. The traverse from the larger rock, at mouth of gulch is as follows.

 21. thence along Paamili, the boundary strikes down to the bottom of the Waikuaia gulch which is the first branch to the east of the Waiprae gulch said gulch Waikuaia being called at its mouth the Waikuaia, to a large rock on the upper part of ground

25. S. 6. 6. E. true 1779 feet along Kealia, aupuni, to a large pile of stones, at seashore at a place called "Pae Paakai".

26. Thence along sea shore to point of commencement. The traverse along the shore being as follows.

Containing an area of Five thousand eight hundred & ninety seven (5) Acres, more or less; excepting and reserving to the Hawaiian Government, all mineral or metallic mines of every description.

To Have and to Hold the above granted Land in Fee Simple, unto the said Ms. Kekauonohi His Heirs and Assigns forever, subject to the taxes to be from time to time imposed by the Legislative Council, equally upon all Landed Property held in Fee Simple.

In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto set my hand, and caused the Great Seal of the Hawaiian Islands to be affixed, this Eleventh (11) day of April 1878.
