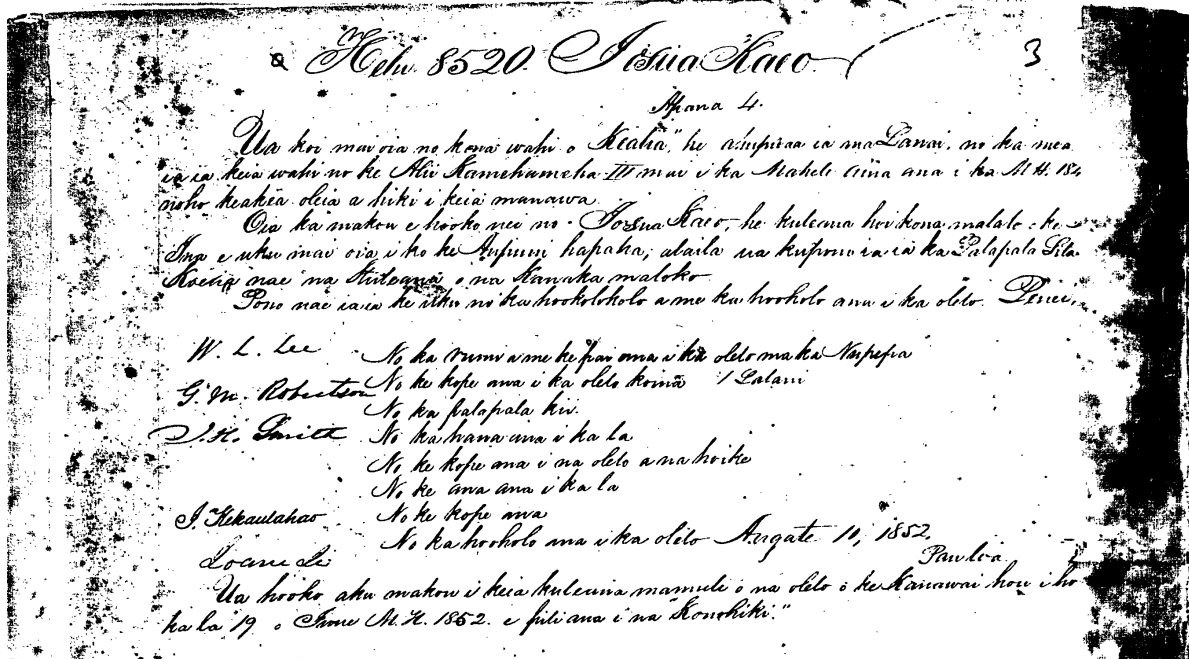

**ROYAL PATENT.**

Upon Confirmation by the Land Commission.

**WHEREAS**, The Board of Commissioners to quiet Land Titles have by their decision awarded unto

— Iosua Kaeo — J. C. Alvord, 8520.

an estate of **Freehold** less than Allodial, in and to the Land hereafter described, and whereas Walter M. Gibson the present occupier of the Ahupuaa of Kealiakapu has applied to the Minister of the Interior for a Royal Patent for said Ahupuaa, and has filed a certified copy of the boundaries of the same with the Commission of Boundaries for the islands of Lanai, and whereas the Government contribution thereon amounting to — Fifty — dollars (\$ 50 ) has been paid unto the Royal Exchequer.

**WHEREFORE**, <sup>Kalakaui</sup> ~~Kalakaui~~, by the Grace of God, King of the Hawaiian Islands, by this Royal Patent, makes known to all men, that he has, for himself and his successors in office, this day granted and given absolutely, in Fee Simple, unto

Iosua Kaeo.

all that certain piece of Land situated known as the Ahupuaa of Kealiakapu in the Island of Lanai — and described as follows:

- Commencing at the South corner of this land at a pile of stones, over a cross X cut in a large stone, to the west of a small bay, at the mouth of a deep rocky gulch (which gulch is the boundary between Kealiakapu and Kealia Ahupuaa) at a place called Comafutua.
1. Thence runs up the bottom of said gulch to a point on the west bank marked by a stone which point bears S. 4° 25' E. true 4960 feet from commencement.
  2. Thence up the bottom of the gulch to a point on west bank marked by a stone, which point bears from last point S. 8° 16' E. true 849 feet.
  3. Thence still up the bottom of the gulch to a point on north bank marked by a stone, which point bears from last point S. 13° 13' E. true 2196 feet.
  4. Thence up bottom of gulch to a point on the north bank marked by a cross on limestone which point bears, S. 30° 24' E. true 618 feet from last point.
  5. Thence still up bottom of gulch to a point marked with a cross on stone, on which point the bearing from the last point is N. 44° 54' E. true 1636 ft.
  6. Thence N. 30° 27' E. true 543 ft along Kealia Ahupuaa to a cross X cut in a stone at an old house site.
  7. N. 54° 37' E. true 2364 feet along Kealia Ahupuaa to a cross cut in a stone.
  8. N. 44° 44' E. true 1660 feet along Kealia Ahupuaa to a point marked by two triangular pits dug in the ground, at the former site of Kaunakipalapa.
  9. S. 48° 00' E. true 963 ft along Kealia Ahupuaa to a point marked by two pits & a little site of a native house at margin of Salama crater.
  10. N. 75° 16' E. true 14966 feet along Kealia Ahupuaa across the crater to a large rock, with a cross on the face of it, on the north side of a small ravine on the eastern wall of the crater in a locality called Shakoa.
  11. N. 53° 10' E. true 720 feet along Kealia Ahupuaa to top of terrace or house to a point marked by two triangular pits, and buried bottle.
  12. N. 44° 5' E. true 1560 feet along Kealia Ahupuaa to a large rock marked with a cross & said rock being called Sohakupukapuka.
  13. N. 24° 18' E. true 4133 feet along Kealia Ahupuaa to two pits & a little site at the edge of a deep ravine that runs along the foot of the central mountain ridge to the north ending to the west.
  14. N. 41° 43' E. true 2150 feet along Kealia Ahupuaa across said ravine, and up a ridge to the summit of the mountain range.

15. S. 72° 00' W. true 1025 feet along top of the mountain
16. Thence S. 32° 16' W. true 1660 feet along Kaunolu down to a red ridge to the north of the above mentioned ridge to a point marked by two hipits & a bottle at the edge of a gulch to the north of the last mentioned summit
17. Thence down the bottom of this gulch and of the main gulch, to a point on the S bank marked by two hipits & a bottle, which point bears S 61° 45' W. true 3482 feet from last point.
18. Thence down the bottom of the main gulch to a point on East bank, marked by two hipits & a bottle, which point bears from last point S. 36° 21' W. true 930 feet.
19. Thence still down the bottom of the gulch to a point on E bank, marked by two hipits & a bottle which bears from last mentioned point S 18° E true 588 feet.
20. Thence still down the bottom of the gulch which where it enters the crater is called the (Kaunolu) to a large rock at mouth on the lower side of the road, marked with a cross + and called Pohakuloa, which rock bears S. 46° 20' W. true 2650 ft from last mentioned point.
21. S. 44° 8' W. true 13375 feet along Kaunolu across the crater to a point marked by two hipits & a bottle S.E. of a white house belonging to Oluar
22. S. 62° 24' W. true 3889 ft along Kaunolu to a point marked by two hipits & a post near an old house site.
23. S. 42° 37' W. true 1698 ft along Kaunolu to a point marked by two hipits &
24. S. 48° 30' W. true 1275 ft along Kaunolu to a point marked by two hipits &
25. S. 32° 55' W. true 3125 ft along Kaunolu to a rock marked with a cross &
26. S. 18° 11' W. true 1637 ft along Kaunolu to a rock marked thus → in a clump of rocks.
27. S. 25° 00' W. true 2280 feet along Kaunolu to a rock marked with a cross & at the commencement of a small gulch.
28. Thence down the bottom of said gulch and larger gulch, (that reached the sea near the Hehu) to a point marked by a cross X on a stone on the south east branch of the gulch, at a bend in it, which point bears from last mentioned point S. 27° 23' W. true 3663 ft.
29. Thence down the bottom of the gulch passing to the NW of a well in a gulch (which well belongs to Hehu) to a large rock marked with a cross X and from thence to the sea at a point on the shore at the middle of the harbor, which point bears from the rock on the bank of the gulch at the bend S. 33° 57' W. true 1343 ft.
30. Thence following the sea coast to point of commencement, the bearings along the shore being as follows. S. 63° 20' E. true 400 ft to a cut on larger stone at 53° 20' E. true 3353 ft to X cut in stone at 78° 30' E. true 2376 - to point of commencement.

Containing an area of one thousand eight hundred & twenty nine <sup>acres</sup> more or less; excepting and reserving to the Hawaiian Government, all mineral or metallic mines of every description.

**To Have and to Hold** the above granted Land in Fee Simple, unto the said Asiwa. Iaco his Heirs and Assigns forever, subject to the taxes to be from time to time imposed by the Legislative Council, equally upon all Landed Property held in Fee Simple.

**In Witness Whereof**, I have hereunto set my hand, and caused the Great Seal of the Hawaiian Islands to be affixed, this 25<sup>th</sup> day of June 1878.
