As far as my duties extend as an Executor, I claim on the part of the several parties mentioned, the lands specified, with all the privileges & immunities appertaining to Lands given on the Battle Field, as by Custom or by Law established.

In the Name of God, Amen.. Whereas I John Young being of sound & perfect mind, (thanks be to God for the same) but of infirm health, do make and ordain this my last will & testament in manner & form following (namely) First I hereby bequeath & confirm my dear Wife Mary other- wise called Kuanoo, in possession of all those lands, which she antecedent to the date hereof has received in free gift from me. To wit.

One Land situated in the district of Puna called Kaimonoa
Also one Land situated in the district of Waikua, called
Lahua.

Four Lands situated in the district of Kohala (namely) Kanihewaa, Hoowalehalawa, Kealahou, & Kaupo; all on the Island of Hawaii.

Further I give the rest & residue of the Lands which I hold poss-
ession of in the Kingdom of the Sandwich Islands

23 1st to wit twenty three lands on the Island of Hawaii: namely -
Kukuihala - Waikohakake nui Waikohakake iki, in the
district of Puna. Kukuwau nui and Kukuwau iki in the
district of Kilauea. Waikohala - Waiaha nui - Waiaha iki, Ouli
Kapaa, Waika, Kiiikalani and Kawaihae in the district
of Kohala - Hianololi, Kahului, Pahochoeiti, Puhua
Kasapaa, Kalama, Kilauea, and two small Iles at Hailua
in the district of Hona.

2nd Five lands on the Island of Maui, namely Uaino, in
the district of Hana; Kalaheke in the district of Hamakua -
Honokahua, in the district of Kaanapali; Kapawaka
and Kalea, in the district of Lahaina.

3rd One land in the Island of Lanai, called Maunalei.

4th One land in the Island of Molokai called Kapehu.

5th And two lands on the Island of Oahu, namely Halawa
in the district of Ewa, and Pahoa in the district of Waikiki.

I give and bequeath to be equally divided between my sur-
viving children and the surviving children of my departed
friends - the late Isaac Davis of Milford in England, in
such manner as it may please his Majesty the King & his
Chiefs - Provided always - that each and all of the said
children receive a just and equal portion. Further -
the rest & residue of my Estate, Goods & Chattels I give and bequeath
to be equally divided Among my surviving children & the
division to be superintended by his Britannic Majesty's
Consul residing at the time of my decease at the said
said Islands; or such person or persons, whom the said
Consul may appoint. Further - I hereby do constitute, constitute
and appoint Alexander Adams and Thomas Charles Byrd
Brooks, joint Executors of this my last will & Testament.

Hereby Revoking all other and former Wills by me at any time heretofore made, In Witness whereof - I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Twenty sixth day of June, in the Year of our Lord One thousand, Eight Hundred and Thirty four.

 ner and form following (that is to say) First in behalf of
 (deceased) my deceased Friend Isaac Davis and for his Children as he
 (deceased) died without a Will, the King Tamumahanna gave to me
 all the said Isaac Davises Lands and to take care of them
 and his Children until his Children came of age, and now
 they are come of age So I think it right to leave my last
 Will & wishes that the King and Tahamans Adams & Rooki
 and all the Chiefs will Let Isaac Davises Children keep their
 Fathers Lands that King Tamumahanna gave to him as a
 Reward for assisting him the King in his War in conquering
 the islands of Oahu, Mowee, Molotoy and Waahoo and
 which we have undoubted Right to Give to our Children which
 I hope in God our Young King will fulfill the wishes of his hon-
 ored Father. My own Lands I wish my Children to enjoy as
 I have don Likewise my Wife the Lands I got from Tamma-
 hanna for my Services to him in his Wars in conquering
 the Islands of Oahu, Mowee, Molotoy and Waahoo and
 at his decess he told his Son Rooki to take care of me and
 my Children which I hope in God our Young King John
 and Tamuna Governor Adams and Rooki and all the
 leading Chiefs will fulfill the wishes of our ever lamented
 & beloved King Tamumahanna it is my wish that
 they be sacred to my Children & Wife if you think more
 proper to those that do Will the greatest portion, but all
 in all, and I hope they will prove true & faithful Subjects

In the name of God, Amen. Whereas I, John Young, being of sound & perfect mind (thanks be to God for the same) but of infirm health, do make and ordain this my last will & testament in manner & form following; namely...:

First, I hereby bequeath & confirm my dear wife Mary, otherwise called Kuamoo, in possession of all those lands, which she antecedent to the date hereof has received in free gift from me, to wit:

One land situated in the district of Puna & called Kamomoa [Kamoamo]. Also, one land situated in the district Hamakua, called Koloakui. Also four lands situated in the district of Kohala namely Ohuowao, Hoowalehalawa, Kealahewa & Kaupo; all on the Island of Hawaii.

Further, all the rest & residue of the lands which I held possession of under the King & Chiefs of the Sandwich Islands.

4th. To wit, twenty-three lands on the Island of Hawaii; namely Kukuihala, Waikahekahenui, Waikahekaheiki, in the district of Puna; Kukuwau [Kukuau] nui and Kukuwau iki in the district of Hilo; Waikoloa, Waiaka nui, Waiaka iki, Ouli, Kapaa, Waika, Kiiokalani and Kawaihae in the district of Kohala; Hianaloli, Kahului, Pahoehoe iki, Pahea, Kaopapa, Kalama, Kiilae, and two small ilis at Kailua, in the district of Kona.

5th. Five lands on the Island of Maui, namely Uaino [Ulaino] in the district of Hana; Halehaku in the district of Hamakualoa; Honokahua in the district of Kaanapali; Kapewakua and Haleu in the district of Lahaina.

6th. One land in the Island of Lanai, called Maunalei.

7th. One land in the Island of Molokai called Kupeke.

8th. And two lands on the Island of Oahu, namely, Halawa in the district of Ewa, and Pahoia in the district of Waikiki.

I give and bequeath to be equally divided between my surviving children and the surviving children of my departed friend, the late Isaac Davis of Milford in England, in such manner as it may please his Majesty, the King & his Chiefs, provided always, that each and all of the said children receive a just and equal portion. Further all the rest & residue of my estate, goods & chattels I give & bequeath to be equally divided among my surviving children with division to be superintended by his Britannic Majesty's consul residing at the time of my decease at the Sandwich Islands; or such person or persons, as he, the said consul, may appoint. Further, I nominate, constitute and appoint Alexander Adams and Thomas Charles Byde Rooke, joint Executors of this, my last Will & Testament.

Hereby revoking all other and former Wills by me at any time heretofore made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Twenty-sixth day of June, in the Year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and thirty four.
